I am thrilled by the number o folks, not just reading, but exploring and practicing the thoughts in, and inspirations reaped from discussion of our Lenten book, “Balancing Act”. There is a buzz in a group of folks practicing their faith.


I remember how un-inspiring it was to hear my sisters practicing the piano each day—the scales, the repetition, the mistakes—so I got to just tuning it out... That is until one day when I found my good friend, Tom, sitting in rapt attention on our couch. I asked him what he was doing. “I am listening to the wonderful music your sister is playing”. Because I was taken by Tom, I sat down next to him to listen, too. I was amazed to discover my sister’s ability to play the most amazing Debussy! Why, who would have guessed she’d gotten so good?

I think about our faith, do we realize the power of practicing to help deepen our experience of God’s life-giving love? That is what Lent is about, taking time to practice. Sure our lives are filled with mistakes and repetition of lessons—yet every once in a while, if we pause and listen to the song of our heart, the loving melody of our outreach, we just might hear something even greater than Debussy!

“When I talk about “practicing our faith,” I am thinking about “practice” in the most common use of that term. That is, we have to practice our faith the same way we practice the piano, or practice dancing, or practice a variety of skills and crafts. Our faith is, in many ways, something we learn more about and grow in by doing, by trying to embody or live out our intentions and ideals, and by learning from our failures as well as our successes.”

UMCOR Response in Haiti

The United Methodist Committee on Relief had been active in Haiti before the earthquake and has plans to provide earthquake relief until at least 2015.

Their recovery plan has three phases: *emergency*, *recovery* and *rehabilitation*.

- The *emergency* phase will last through April (the rainy season begins in March). During this initial phase UMCOR is addressing the most immediate needs of access to food, clean water and sanitation, temporary shelter and emotional and spiritual support.
- The *recovery* phase will focus on rebuilding and volunteers will soon be needed to go to Haiti to help rebuild lives and homes, clinics and churches. Livelihood restoration and income generation will be a part of this phase.
- During the *rehabilitation* phase they will offer assistance for physical reconstruction and economic development, as well as rebuilding systems like health and education.

So far, donations for UMCOR-Haiti from around the world have topped \$14.5 Million. More than 350,000 health kits have been received and are being processed for distribution and layette kits are beginning to come in for babies being born in the temporary shelters.

Our congregation has sent over \$5,000 to UMCOR for Haiti. Even though our special emphasis on giving for Haiti will end at Easter, know that you can give at any time. Funds will be needed for a long time and the more we give, the more UMCOR can do. Just identify either on the check or an envelope that you want the money to go to UMCOR-Haiti. **EVERY DOLLAR YOU GIVE WILL MAKE A DIFFERENCE TO THOSE WHOSE NEEDS ARE SO GREAT!**



Chicken Soup for the Soul: Christian Teen Talk by Jack Canfield. 101 true stories from Christian teens who talk about growing up and their relationship with God.

Do Hard Things by Alex & Brett Harris. Written by teens for teens, the authors outline five powerful ways young people can respond to low expectations and cultural pressures.

Facing the Facts: the Truth about Sex and You by Stan and Brenna Jones. Information about what happens during puberty and why God planned it to happen that way.

Heart of a Shepherd by Rosanne Parry. Heart-warming novel about a boy who takes on grown up responsibilities on the family ranch when his father is sent to Iraq.

How to Stay Christian in High School by Steve Gerali. Examples of teenagers in the Bible inspire today's teens to handle the temptations and pressures they face every day.

Student's Bible Handbook edited by Neil S. Wilson. Follow the suggested reading plan and visit all the major events and stories in this personal guide to understanding the Bible.

Take Your Best Shot by Austin Gutwein. Inspirational true story of nine-year-old Austin Gutwein and his organization "Hoops of Hope," set up to raise money for orphans in Africa.


Easter Decorating
