CELEBRATE FALL

Coming into September (Hard to believe it's already here again!) - As we try to gear up for another school term and The Fair (with all its interruptions to our schedules and traffic), the church year slips into the new Season of Creation.

This is a recent (semi-official, but growing in acceptance) addition to the year-long liturgical cycle of celebrating God's work in our lives of faith.** (The Church Year includes the life and teachings of Christ, the work of the Holy Spirit, and our own times of penitence and commission into the ministry.) It seems fitting to add the "Season of Creation" (here in the middle of "Ordinary Time") — to give time to delight and praise in God's good and amazing creatures and handiworks (the Psalmists did), and to recognize our part in its stewardship.

This morning, as I was listening to the KPLU two-minute radio spot, "Bird Note," I was absolutely blown away by its snippet on the Snipe:

One summer, Swedish ornithologists attached tiny tracking devices to ten Great Snipes. A year later, they found that one bird had flown from Sweden to Central Africa, a distance of 4,225 miles, in just three and a half days. For some the coming of fall is full of excitement—a new school year, leaves turning... For others it seems like just another season in the endless cycle. Lately I've heard, "It's September again; well, at least maybe we won't have to water." We get jaded by the efforts of the day to day. We lose track of wonder.

My Brothers and Sisters, with amazing discoveries like the flight of Snipes, taking a few moments each morning to consider the creation can be a wonderful antidote to jaded routine. The Season of Creation is to stir wonder and caring, to tickle the imagination—to offer a prayer for inspiration (to spice up our lives) from the most incredible inventor of all, our God. (If the Lord could make snipes and porcupines, don't you think the Lord could help us come up with something unexpectedly wondrous for our days?)

September is here, whippee! Blessings and Wonder to You All.

EPCC FOOD FIGHT

Of the 9 churches and 1 fellowship, 4 churches reported their number of items and donations collected each week. We collected a total of 1975 food items which is an average of 2.9 items per attendee. Over the same 4 week period we collected \$1,492.00 which breaks down to \$2.17 per attendee.

About \$2.00 = 3 Meals for 4 people. This means that we fed a family of 4 for 2 years. The food bank says \$.67 can purchase 1 meal. This breaks down to 2,226 meals. A Job Well Done.

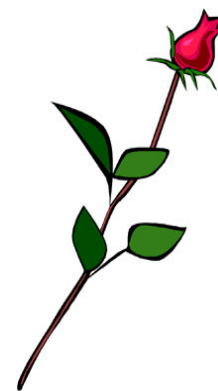

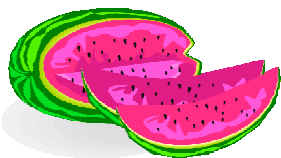

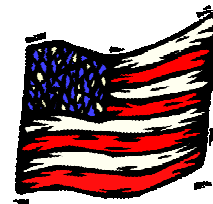

DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY

Classes Now Forming. Space is Limited.

Disciple Bible Study classes are now forming for the fall. Classes start the week of September 26 and run 32-34 weeks. We are offering two Disciple courses for this fall. Pray about joining or re-joining a group of faithful disciples as they study the Bible for the year.

Disciple I – Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study

Monday evenings, 7:00-9:15 pm
Starts September 26th

BECOMING DISCIPLES THROUGH BIBLE STUDY is the foundation of the **DISCIPLE** Bible Study program and is open to all who would like to attend and learn more about the Bible. This class is a 34-week journey through the biblical story from Genesis to Revelation.

DISCIPLE affirms that the Bible was formed in order for God to speak to us. **BECOMING DISCIPLES THROUGH BIBLE STUDY** gives equal time to both the Old and New Testament, emphasizing the wholeness of the Bible as the revelation of God. **DISCIPLE** aims at transformation, not just information, and calls on persons to submit themselves to examination by Scripture, to put themselves under the power of God's Word, and to be changed by God's Word. **DISCIPLE** invites persons to bring their experiences and struggles to the Scripture.

During the course of thirty-four weeks, groups will move through the biblical stories of Creation to the New Jerusalem. The titles of the sessions along with theme words, theme verses, and major persons, events, and topics will set the sequence of the biblical story in the minds of the participants. The principal Scripture for each session follows the chronological movement of the biblical story.

Disciple IV – Under the Tree of Life

Disciple I is a prerequisite for this class.

UNDER THE TREE OF LIFE is a thirty-two-week study prepared for graduates of **BECOMING DISCIPLES THROUGH BIBLE STUDY**.

UNDER THE TREE OF LIFE concentrates on the writings in the Old Testament – Ruth, 1 and 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Solomon, Lamentations, and Daniel. New Testament Scriptures include the Gospel of John; 1, 2, and 3 John; James; Jude; and Revelation.

Emphasis on the Psalms as Israel's hymnbook and prayer book leads naturally to an emphasis on worship in the study. Present though the entire study is the sense of living toward completion, toward the climax of the message and the promise, extravagantly pictured in the Revelation.
